Cross-Campus Exchange: Daisy Bates Civic Engagement Summit at BHSEC Baltimore



To celebrate the first full year of the BHSEC Network Civic Engagement Initiatives, students from BHSEC Queens and Harlem Children's Zone traveled to BHSEC Baltimore to participate in the first ever Daisy Bates Civic Engagement Summit. All students involved had the opportunity to share their social action projects alongside community members and participate in a

workshop lead by local changemakers Dr. Lawrence Brown and Dr. Tahira Mahdi. Dr. Lawrence Brown is an associate professor at Morgan State University whose work focuses on the impact of historical trauma on community health, including racial segregation, forced residential displacement, and economic disinvestment. Dr. Tahira Mahdi is a community psychologist who regularly gives workshops on service-learning and community engagement. The student and community members in attendance shared projects on a wide variety of topics including immigration reform, water access and privatization, student rights and advocacy, mental health initiatives for queer black girls, lead testing and abatement, and working family advocacy and rights. Thus for the first time BHSEC Queens beat out all schools on the hardest team round in the history of the competition. Elisabeth Gambino (Baltimore) has been awarded a Fulbright-Hays grant from the Department of State for research on ecological and cultural conservation practices in Ecuador this July-August.
