Academic Support Opportunities



🐣 (Fluffy) Baby on Bard 🐣

Meet the newest member of the Bronx Zoo! Hatched on February 25th, this tiny, (still nameless) baby king vulture might be the cutest predator in the neighborhood. His or her --we don't know the baby's gender yet-- parents (Dad, 55; Mom, 20) were set up on their first date right here in the Bronx. According to Chuck Cerbini, the zoo's curator of ornithology, King vultures are monogamous so it's important that zookeepers ensure the pairing's compatibility.

The chick is being raised by zookeepers because of its unique genetics; its father only has one living ancestor who shares this DNA. This setup, however, comes at a cost; birds raised by humans risk failing to forge normal bird relationships when returned to their own kind. In order to prevent this from happening, zoo professionals have been feeding the baby vulture using a vulture puppet that resembles a fully-grown parent. Carolyn Fuchs, an artist who works for the zoo, went all out on this puppet project; she went to great lengths to make its colors and proportions accurate. Once a day this fake vulture brings the baby a few tasty bites of dead rodents. YUM!

If the feeding continues to go well, our local fluff ball will get a lot bigger and be around for a long time. According to New York magazine, adult king vultures can have a six-and-a-half-foot wingspan, and the oldest known one is nearly 73 and still going. That's a big bird!
