## COURSE SEQUENCE AND SELECTION GUIDE DEPARTMENT OF LITERATURES BARD HIGH SCHOOL EARLY COLLEGE QUEENS

The Department of Literatures offers students at BHSEC a wide range of courses in the fields of English, Comparative Literature, Creative Writing, Media Studies, and Cultural Studies.

## WHY TAKE LITERATURE COURSES?

Literary study involves appreciation of aesthetics, exploration of historical contexts and cultural perspectives, and investigation into theories of narrative, poetics, and rhetoric. It is among the most elastic of disciplines, reaching into many adjacent areas of thought, while also offering tightly focused methods of inquiry and analysis. Students of literature are constantly challenged to grow as writers, as critical thinkers, and as thoughtful participants in a culture increasingly organized around the production and exchange of information in the form of texts - capacities that will be highly useful in later study, in a wide range of careers, and in civic life.

## NY STATE REGENTS DIPLOMA AND BARD A.A. DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

Two core courses are required in the high school program. In the college program, all students take a sequence of four required interdisciplinary seminars and at least four semesters of Humanities courses selected from a wide range of elective offerings in literatures and social studies, and history of art, film, or music.

After completing these courses students must pass the corresponding Regents Examination.

## COLLEGE ELECTIVE COURSES

The Department of Literatures encourages broad reading across genres, geographical regions, and historical periods.
